For 2020 Biddeford Pool Community Center maintained an account with the Biddeford High School in the amount of \$2,000.00 to be divided by four students that wish to go on to college. This is a tradition that has been in place at BPCC since the 1960's and in 1992 became the Joan Beaudry Memorial Education Fund. Joan was a teacher in the Biddeford school system for many years so the fund is for students that will be attending college with the intention of becoming a teacher.

BPCC scholarship committee is also providing three students from within our community \$1,000.00 each to further their college education. The applicants were all members or were sponsored by a member and all filed an application.
