

Message from the President

The Board of Trustees voted to close the Center two years ago this month. It was not something we wanted to do, but we felt we had to for your safety. Recently due to the dedication of our fabulous volunteers the Center has opened for limited use. But the volunteers have not limited their efforts solely to reopening the building. Peruse this newsletter to see the classes, programs, and events the volunteers have scheduled for you. Some of the activities you'll come across include writing and drawing classes, a Fun with Poetry program, bridge sessions, lectures related to Maine provided in conjunction with York County Senior College, Earth Day happenings, and a St. Patrick's Day dinner raffle. We may even have another one of those spectacular BPCC nontraditional Easter parades. Let's hope we can continue to move to a more normal BPCC schedule of activities and happenings in the coming months.

In the annual letter that accompanied your membership renewal envelope, I mentioned the three-generation Afghan family relocating to Biddeford and the assistance provided to them by BPCC members. This assistance has taken many forms. In addition to driving family members to medical appointments, adult education classes, labs tests, and appointments with government officials, BPCC members have undertaken both routine and major home improvements to the house all three generations of the family will move into later this month. BPCC members have also provided financial and in-kind support for this family.

Jen and Eddie Fullmer are coordinating the assistance to the family. Here is an excerpt of the update Jen providede:

Hakim, his wife Shafiqa, and his entire family send their sincere thanks to all of you who have provided a warm welcome and who have generously contributed resources and support. The kids are in Biddeford Schools and the whole family is very busy with resettlement appointments. The family has many needs. One of the greatest needs is transportation and we are looking for someone to donate a car. Another great need is rent money for the house where the family will live in.
